Boys & Girls Clubs are open after school and during school breaks to provide children and teens with a safe place to go where they can connect with caring adults. Professional staff and volunteers use a combination of locally developed programs and those developed and tested nationally by Boys & Girls Clubs of America to help youth achieve success in the following areas: Academics, Character & Citizenship, and Healthy Lifestyles.

Club programs build protective factors in youth which nurture their well-being. Club members develop problem-solving skills, learn healthy eating and exercise habits, and build skills for lifelong health.



Programs offered by Boys & Girls Clubs of Thurston County ensure that Club members have the support they need to succeed academically and graduate from high school ready to pursue college or a career. Programs guide Club youth to develop leadership skills, make healthy lifestyle choices, and positively impact their community. Some of the more innovative programs implemented at our Clubs include:

Get Good Grades (G3) Targeted academic tutoring and wraparound support for students facing challenges meeting grade standards.

SMART Girls Small group mentoring designed to encourage healthy attitudes and lifestyles, enabling early adolescents to develop their potential.

Social and Emotional Well-Being Group or one-on-one coaching with a mental health professional to develop social skills.


Homeless Youth Support Services Collaboration with local school districts to offer enhanced Club membership for students experiencing homelessness.

Science Exploration Series Collaboration with Saint Martin's University to deliver fun, hands-on education in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).


